CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT:

This has been my second year as chairperson and the Friends have continued to support new services and provide equipment to the value of around £100,000.

Several organisations have made us their charity of the year. This includes Rugby Ladies Golf Club, Warwickshire Women's Bowls Association and Rugby Summer Darts League and without them and the help of the Coventry Building Society we would be unable to continue to provide equipment on the same scale.

Special thanks has to go to the staff of the Coventry B.S. who besides the annual donation from the St Cross Saver account of £15,111.00 (£136,310 over 7 years) and printing our raffle tickets have also provided a team of volunteers to paint the new bereavement room which is called the **Sunflower room**. The name



was chosen by them after



hospital staff were invited to suggest names for it and the winner, Sister Kay Holleran, cut the ribbon at an opening ceremony in April. The Friends provided the furnishings to make this room a peaceful and pleasant room for staff to meet with bereaved relatives or when completing care assessments. Another project which has just been completed and opened is the dementia lounge. Again staff were invited to suggest names and our president chose the winning name The Bluebell Lounge which was suggested by both Pauline Barnett and Karen Tomlinson. It is a comfortable and calming room that dementia patients can be taken to by their relatives, friends, carers or members of staff.



We have donated a number of barriatric beds which allow patients in danger of falls to be nursed in low level beds. These can be raised for nursing purposes. It prevents serious falls and allows nursing at a safe level for both patients and staff.



Our Queen's Diamond Jubilee project, completed last year was officially opened on the 16th April by Her Royal Highness Princess Alexandra. She unveiled a memorial plaque and spoke to staff and some of the rehabilitation patients using the equipment and was presented with a bouquet by our oldest volunteer Mary Lock.

Volunteers have just started a trial patient befriending service on Oak Ward. We have quite a few patients from Coventry as there is a definite use of St Cross solely for some services. Some patients are elderly and do not have relatives or friends able to visit them so this service is designed to give those patients an all important visitor. We hope to roll the service out to other wards later in the year.

The twice weekly bookstall has now been extended to three and we have had so many books that we have twice held a bookstall in the Clock Towers shopping centre.

One sad note this year has been the death of Tom Seekings a vice president who despite his bad health continued to attend committee meetings right up to his final illness,

Of course all this work could not continue without our volunteers who give up so much of their time and includes the committee who have supported me as chairperson A big thank you to Tracey and her team who organise fund raising events through the year and Doris who organises the street collections and "tin rattling" days at various stores.

This enables the Main Committee, to be able to respond to requests as quickly as possible and also allows the Hospital Management team more opportunities to share with us any concerns or future plans/requests they may have.

We continue to have a thorough request procedure with every department making a request having to first complete the necessary request form. A representative from the department is also requested to attend a Main Committee meeting to discuss the reasons for their request for all items costing £500 and above. The criteria for purchasing any equipment are that it will benefit Rugby patients. Subject to the funds being available the request is usually agreed

We have received since our formation many, many legacies without which our spending would be severely curtailed. However, we are seeing a considerable fall in funding from 'donations' and 'in memory' which could have an affect on our spending in the future. Please consider a bequest we promise to spend wisely!

EXERCISE BIKES



The Friends donated seven new exercise bikes, costing £7000, for the refurbished Cardiac Rehab facility in Rugby. Patients who have recently suffered a 'heart event' are invited to use the facility as part of their recuperation programme. The bikes pictured include a recumbent bicycle and upright models for patients with differing needs. Picture

HI-LO BEDS AND PRESSURE MATTRESSES

The Friends donated 6 low height beds together with 12 pressure relieving mattresses and 6 pressure relieving chair cushions, which cost a total of £32,000. These will be used in various wards across the hospital. The beds are for patients with a risk of falling out of bed and can be used at normal height while patients



are being attended to and then lowered to a safe height. The mattresses and cushions support the prevention and treatment of pressure ulcers for 'at risk' patients. The new equipment was handed over to Juliet Starkey, General Manager at St Cross, by Heather Green, Chairperson of the Friends.

PATIENT STANDING AIDS



Hoskyn Ward took delivery of two standing aids donated by the Friends at a cost of £1977. Staff nurses Kate Phillips and Laura Butterworth, pictured, try out the new equipment which is used to help patients stand up or sit down when they move from a chair into a bed or vice versa. When the patient is standing on the platform the aid can be rotated so that the patient's back is towards the bed or chair they are going to return to.

BREATHING AND HEALTH MONIORING AIDS



The Virtual Ward at the Orchard Centre in Lower Hillmorton Road took delivery of a selection of breathing and health monitoring aids from the Friends of St Cross. The Virtual Ward is a service that supports patients with long term conditions in particular those with chronic lung conditions. The service aims to empower patients to 'self manage' their own health needs. Amanda Roberts, a physiotherapist at the Centre, is pictured with a selection of the equipment, which cost £1,200 and is loaned to patients to assess for use at home before they decide to buy their own. Until now there was no

provision in Rugby for patients to access these devices.

REPORTS FROM YOUR MAIN COMMITTEE

SECRETARY:

The role continues to develop as there is an ever increasing number of events to both diary and record. 2013 and the first few months of 2014 have been a partricularly busy time resulting in a number of small sub committees being formed to enable projects to be developed away from the main committee meetings. This will prove to be extremely beneficial when the main committee and sub committees start to plan events for the Friends Diamond Jubilee celebrations in 2015.

VOLUNTEER CO-ORDINATORS:

There has been an encouraging increase in the number of volunteers wishing to join the Friends. We now have 209 volunteers, which is the highest number of volunteers we have ever had. A high proportion of requests are made via our web site.

Tea Bar & Help Desk

We currently have 74 volunteers on the Tea Bar and 45 on the Help Desks with no vacancies remaining. The Tea Bar profit increased by 8.6% to £9,465, which is an excellent result. The sale of Second Hand books in the Out Patients Department has boosted the profit and we have every hope of passing the £10,000 profit mark in the current year.

Life Membership

A Life Membership Award will be presented at the Annual General Meeting to Mrs Elizabeth McKinley and to Mrs Ann Gillon who have both been members of the House to House Collection Team for many years. The Friends would like to express their gratitude to Elizabeth and Ann for all their hard work and dedication. The funds they have helped to collect have been spent across the Hospital and Community Health and Mental Health Services.

Value For Money

As the number of volunteer services we operate at St. Cross continues to grow we thought it would be useful to work out just how much time our wonderful teams put in and estimate an approximate value for that.

Taking all our services on site volunteers put in nearly **11,000** hours in 2013. This was accumulated by committee members and officers who put in around **1400** hours; the two Help Desks and the Outpatients Department Tea Bar where volunteers work around **8000** hours a year and of course volunteer hours provided by our various teams who kindly provide services throughout the hospital.

Putting a financial value on this terrific effort – if all our volunteers and committee members were paid at the national minimum wage of £6.31 per hour this would produce a value of over £69,000 per annum that is a staggering contribution to the services at our hospital.

Since our average annual expenditure on gifts to St. Cross and community health services is around £100,000 this means that the value of our gross input to the hospital is a huge £169,000 a year.

Our constitution remains the key governing document thus particular attention has been given to legislation relating to requirements set out by the Charity Commission, Government Legislation, Health & Safety Policy and Risk Assessment.

This has resulted in our Code of Practices, Protocols, Volunteer Agreement, Capability, IT, Communications, Health & Safety and Risk Assessments being amended or developed to ensure we meet current requirements.

I am pleased to report that the Charity's documentation is comprehensive, robust and meets its legislative obligations for the year 2014.

IT AND COMMUNICATIONS:

Our website continues to be accessed by approximately 25 users every day. However, we have decided that the site needs a refresh and have worked with Warwickshire College to give students a 'real life' project to design a new look and feel for the website. Twelve students were invited to submit proposals as a competitive exercise, which went through two knockout stages to select a winning proposal. The winner has been selected and his name will be announced when the site is transferred from the college systems to our website which we hope will be completed in June.

Over the past year we have increased our digital presence with expansion of the use of Facebook, where we publish articles on our latest activities at the same time as we release news to the local press. Recent postings reached over 300 Facebook users seeing the posts about the Royal Visit and the Book Sale in Clock Towers - record, so far, was the 1,786 who saw the photo album of the Valentine's Dinner and Dance!

We also contribute to websites managed by others including

- localgiving.com where supporters can set up sponsorship pages
- <u>aroundme.co.uk</u> publishers of the Around Rugby Magazine which is delivered to 14,000 homes in the town

We have recently ventured into e-newsletters with the first one published in February and the next one planned for after the AGM - sign up for this on our Facebook page or email office@friendsofstcross.org.uk to be added to the mail list.

Press coverage throughout the year has been excellent with one or two articles appearing in either the Rugby Advertiser or the Rugby Observer every month.

We are extremely grateful to The Coventry for their continued support of the twice yearly printed Friends News - which they design and print for us. The last edition was extended to 4 pages - there has been so much to report!

NEW PROJECTS: Since its foundation the charity has always been keen to explore new ways of supporting our hospital and the outstanding example has been the extremely successful affinity account, the St. Cross Saver, operated by "The Coventry" which has raised well over £100,000 to date. We now have one member of the Main Committee with a specific role to look at and develop new ideas.

Book sales - One of these ideas has seen the charity introduce book sales in the Out Patient Department and this has already expanded from one day per week to three, with sales off site at the Clock Towers Centre, courtesy of the Centre management, to whom our grateful thanks. This is producing a very welcome new income stream.



Roadshows - Two other ideas are being worked on with our popular Roadshows. There has been a welcome increase in the number of bookings these talks and we are developing plans to use visual aids to improve their presentation and to incorporate some examples of how individual patients have benefited from equipment donated by the charity to our hospital.

Youth engagement - The charity has long engaged with older people and we are seeking ways of making contact with young people. To this end a Roadshow was presented to one of our senior schools, a first ever for the charity.

Volunteering - The list of volunteering opportunities continues to grow with the development of the patient feeding scheme and patient visiting and we are always ready to discuss new proposals with the hospital manager.

Looking forward - Fund raising is a major part of the charity's activities and we welcome ideas or proposals for fundraising, or sponsorship from local business and organisations. Next year is a golden opportunity for the people of Rugby again to demonstrate their support for the Hospital of St. Cross as it is our DIAMOND JUBILEE year. Yes 60 years since our formation. FUND RAISING:

£9661 raised in 2013. A record year for the fundraising team.

Our events included our Black Tie Dinner & Dance, A Quik Witz Quiz, Flower Power 2, Battlefield Line trip and a Christmas cake demonstration that led to this fantastic amount of money.









So far this year we have raised over £4000 at our Black Tie alone.

In 2014 we are hoping to raise a total of £10,000 to buy additional specialist equipment for the newly re-furbished operating theatres at St Cross. Over 60% of the elective orthopaedic surgery undertaken by the hospitals in Coventry and Rugby is actually done at St Cross and this will increase the range of operations which can be carried out, further cementing its place in the community.

I would like to thank all of the people who attended our events.

STREET COLLECTIONS:

The collections team have had a very busy and successful year with many of the tins being held by shops etc. collecting variable amounts, but added together bring in a regular income. VOLUNTEERING OPORTUNITIES

Although a number of the volunteering opportunities currently have a waiting list we are always in need of new and enthusiastic members who are able to use and adapt their knowledge and skills in various ways.

We particularly need volunteers who are interested and willing to consider becoming part of the teams which do House to House collections, Ad Hoc volunteers for events throughout the year, Patient Feeding and the Patient Impressions Survey. A Patient Reading Scheme is still being developed and a new Patient Befriending Service is currently being trialled.

SUMMARY OF VOLUNTEERING OPPORTUNITIES AVAILABLE

Fund Raising Team: organises various events throughout the year.

Gardening: Currently we maintain an area named after a former President of the Friends, the Derrick Masters Memorial Garden. We also maintain planters outside the Out Patient Department entrance and plant daffodils to enhance our programme of planting over the last few years.

Grant and Funding Co-ordinator: We need to continually research what grants/funding is available to a charity such as the Friends. This position is currently vacant.

Help Desks: We operate Help Desks in two locations; one in the Out Patients Department and one near the entrance to the Day Surgery Unit. Volunteers "Meet and greet", respond to patient and visitor enquiries and escort people to wards and departments. *This service is currently fully staffed.*

Helping Hands in Theatres: Volunteers work in the operating theatre under direct supervision of theatre staff assisting at cataract operations by holding the patient's hand. The service operates on Tuesdays weekly. *This service is currently fully staffed.*

House-to-House Collections: We are always in need of new volunteers who are willing to help with the House-to-House collections as well as with other fund raising activities at local venues throughout the town.

Main Committee: The Main Committee meets once a month at St. Cross Hospital on a Monday between 2 – 4pm. All Main Committee members take on a specific role.

Occasional Cover: We are always in need of volunteers who can help step in and us with events throughout the year.

Patient Befriending Scheme: This scheme has recently been introduced. It is hoped to extend the service to a number of wards.

Patient Feeding Scheme: (Meal Time Assistant) Volunteers aid patients who are experiencing difficulty in feeding themselves due to various medical problems. All volunteers must receive training prior to taking up the post.

Patient Impressions Survey: Volunteers visit wards and departments and record patients' views on the service they have received.

Patient Reading Scheme: Introduction of this scheme is currently on hold.

Photographers: Photographs are taken of all the equipment purchased. Photographs are then sent to various external and internal media contacts. A group of volunteers who have an interest in photography currently fill the positions available.

Speech and Language Therapy (SALT): Volunteers work with the department by assisting patients, who have experienced a stroke, to improve their speech and language skills.

Sub Committee Work: Volunteers are always required to help support the Main Committee in organising specific events throughout the year.

Tea Bar: An old established service providing beverages and light refreshments in the busy Outpatients Department at the hospital. *This service is currently fully staffed.*

New Ideas: The above is a brief summary of the opportunities at the present time. The Friends of St. Cross welcomes any new ideas that will enable enhancement of the services at St. Cross or raise money for equipment.

DONATIONS: We have received numerious donations from supporters throughout the year both from individuals and local organisations. Without these wonderful donations the Friends could not continue to provide over £100,000 of equipment per year. Thank You to everyone. HOSPITAL MANAGEMENT TEAM:

This has been an incredibly exciting year for us at St Cross with many challenges and changes coming our way which, with support from our colleagues and our 'Friends' we have managed to overcome. Of note are the changes to the provision of emergency care on site. September 2013 saw the implementation of the 24/7 Nurse led Urgent Care Centre. The staff are fully trained and have undergone a process of consolidating their academic learning with practical 'hands on experience' and we are really proud of the way that they have embraced the change and continue to manage the service effectively and efficiently. The 'Friends' supported this service with the donation of equipment which has improved the environment and comfort of patients attending.

We also saw the upgrade of one of the theatres which has meant that we are able to undertake more procedures such as joint replacements requiring ultra clean ventilation. Managing these works whilst maintaining activity was an operational challenge but by undertaking the work during our 'quieter' time (in the run up to the Christmas period) we were able to ensure that none of the patients were cancelled as a result of the works, which was a big achievement.

My colleagues and I are continually astounded by the depth and variety of support that the 'Friends' give to the hospital, its staff and visitors and it was for that reason that I was pleased to nominate them for the Queen's Award for Voluntary Services. I am delighted that this was recently recognised with receipt of the award as the support given, both financially and practically, really does help improve the experience for our patients, visitors and staff alike.
