Friends Diamond Jubilee Appeal launched at the AGM

The appeal for £60,000 will underpin a major project to upgrade the Phlebotomy (blood taking) Service at the hospital and ensure that we are able to continue to fund other equipment donations.

The Phlebotomy Service is the service most used by the community in and around Rugby. With several thousand patients per month the service has been under pressure for some time with patients often queuing outside a packed waiting room. The project will relocate the service into the heart of the Rainsbrook Wing, will double the capacity and will have its own dedicated access from what is now the volunteers car park. Chairperson, Heather Green said "This is the first time in recent years that we have launched an appeal and we will be seeking the support of local business as well as the general public and the many clubs and societies who have kindly nominated us as their 'charity of the year'."

Vice President, Tony Cousins said "We wanted a project worthy of our Diamond Jubilee year that really would make a difference and, in discussion with hospital managers, identified the Blood Taking Service scheme. This is a very busy department housed in accommodation that has become inadequate to provide a good service and badly needs new facilities to improve the service which is used more than 60,000 times every year."

"With heavy pressure on its budgets the UHCW NHS Trust has been unable to afford the scheme any immediate priority and we are delighted that we could support a project that will be a clear benefit to so many patients. We know that the Trust shares our pleasure and we all look forward to seeing the patients using the improved facilities."

Queen's Award for Voluntary Service

On the 2nd of June we were delighted to announce that we have been honoured with the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service 2014. We would like to say a huge thank you to everyone who is involved and supports us for making this possible.

This unique UK national honour was created over a decade ago to mark the

Queen's Golden Jubilee in 2002 and has the equivalent status for voluntary groups as the MBE has for individuals. We were the only organisation in Warwickshire, and one of only 111 in the country to be honoured this way in 2014.

Juliet Starkey, General Manager at St Cross, said "The Friends give fantastic support to the staff at the hospital and their donations have made a clear difference to the patient experience in St Cross. There is not an operational department in the hospital that has not at some time benefited from a donation from the Friends and so I was pleased to nominate them for this national recognition."

Pride of Rugby Special Award

Several members of The Friends went to The Pride of Rugby Awards ceremony on the 9th May to support Edie Freeman who had been nominated and short listed for the Long Service Volunteer Award after 50 years service. Edie did not win her category of Award but we were surprised and delighted to receive a Special Award for the charity as a whole. The judges told us afterwards that so many members of the charity had been nominated they felt that a Special Award was called for!
