### HRH Princess Alexandra opens the Diamond Jubilee Rehabilitation Centre

HRH Princess Alexandra officially opened the new Diamond Jubilee Rehabilitation Centre at the Hospital of St Cross on the 16th of April.

During the visit to the Rugby hospital the Princess spoke with staff and patients who use the facilities. Her Royal Highness also spent time speaking with members of the Friends of the Hospital of St Cross and UHCW Charity, whose kind donations have enabled the project to take place. At the end of the tour Princess Alexandra unveiled a commemorative plague to mark the occasion and was presented with a posy by Mary Lock. Mary was chosen as at the age of 91, she is the oldest serving volunteer and has been an integral part of the Friends team for over 17 years. The Princess also spoke to Joan Jesson, President, and Heather Green, Chairperson, about the work done by the Friends.

The Diamond Jubilee Project has been undertaken to reorganise inpatient rehabilitation services at the Hospital of St Cross. The project has seen the move of the Cardiac Rehabilitation Unit into a new area. This has facilitated a new therapy gym attached to both a relocated Mulberry



Rehabilitation Ward and Oak Rehabilitation Ward. In addition a new day hospital/ activities area has also been introduced. The Friends contributed £44,563 towards the cost of the project and 6 new bikes for the Cardiac Rehab gym.

Andy Meehan, Chair of University Hospitals Coventry & Warwickshire NHS Trust which runs St Cross said: "Today's visit by HRH Princess Alexandra is a glowing tribute to the extreme hard work of the Friends of St Cross and UHCW Charity. I know I speak on behalf of all the staff when I say that the Hospital of St Cross is a fitting recipient for a royal visit. This is truly a memorable occasion."

Juliet Starkey, Group Manager at the Hospital of St Cross said: "To have an official royal opening is an amazing seal of approval for the great work of both the staff and charitable organisations that have created this project. The rehabilitation centre will greatly benefit the patients who use this and is another example of the recent improvements that have been made to the hospital."

### **Donations for Hoskyn ward**

It is amazing how big a difference £3,000 makes for patients in the hospital. Forty new patient information noticeboards have been located by the beds in the wards. These let the nursing staff know who are the named contacts as well as any special instructions and patient preferences such as the type of mug or cup that they like best.

Ward sister Clare Noden is pictured with Peter Matwijiwskyj of Vinci Facilities Management who kindly donated some technician time to erect the noticeboards.

Staff nurses Kate Phillips and Laura Butterworth are pictured trying out new equipment which is used to help patients stand up or sit down when they move from a chair into a bed or vice versa. When the patient is standing on the platform the aid can be rotated so that the patient's back is towards the bed or chair they are going to.

The Virtual Ward at the Orchard Centre in Lower Hillmorton Road has just taken delivery of a selection of breathing and health monitoring aids. The Virtual Ward is a service that supports patients with long term conditions in particular those with chronic lung conditions. The service aims to empower patients to 'self manage' their own health needs. Amanda Roberts, a physiotherapist at the Centre, is pictured with a selection of the equipment which cost  $\pm 1,200$ and is loaned to patients to assess for use at home before they decide to buy their own. Until now there was no provision in Rugby for patients to access these devices.

## **HOSPITAL MANAGEMENT REPORT**

The last 6 months have been a really exciting time for us at St Cross; we've seen a substantial investment of cash into our Theatre accommodation which, amongst other work, saw the replacement of the obsolete ultra clean ventilation (UCV) canopy in theatre 2 with a new model. This was in support of the plans to maximise use of theatres at St Cross and increase activity. The use of UCV has been proven to reduce the occurrence of micro-organisms within the operating theatre and more specifically at the wound site and is a pre-requisite for all major 'open' procedures such as joint replacement and spinal fusions etc.; surgeries performed by Orthopaedic and Neurological surgeons. These works have ensured that 3 of the 5 theatres are equipped with UCV canopy's and we look forward to seeing the numbers of patients safely passing through our wards gradually increasing over the next few months. The Friends are currently raising money to buy additional equipment to support this expansion of our services.

We have also celebrated the openings of 2 facilities supported by the Friends; the Diamond Jubilee Rehabilitation Centre and the Sunflower Room. Events such as these are a pleasure to be a part of and it was an honour to share the experiences with such a large number of the wider Friends community. These events showcase the close relationships that the Friends and the hospital have.

We have also recently participated in the annual 'Patient-led Inspection of the Care environment' (PLACE) and are eagerly awaiting the outcome of the report. We constantly invest both time and money in trying to improve the experiences of our patients and visitors and the appointment of two Patient Advisors in conjunction with the continued support of both the Friends and our Executive team helps us to achieve this.
